Home learning.

Well done to everyone who has started the online learning lessons. There is a new page on the website for home learning and each week the main themes for each year group will be identified so that parents have an idea what the focuses are. Please remember that pupils are expected to complete the work and these are being checked by staff. Where necessary staff will respond. Pupils are expected to do at least three hours a day and in Key Stage 2 that increases to 4 hours. This does include PE and PSHRE.

Feedback from parents has so far been very positive and we have made calls to the few families who have not yet logged in.

Just some reminders-

- We are expecting pupils to behave online as well as they do in the classrooms. We do not expect them to be eating or be in their nightwear when we are having live lessons.
- Please ensure that your child has a pen and paper with them so that they can make notes if they need.
- Please ensure that it is your child that does the work and not you. Whilst you will want to support them, by doing the work for them does not help your child make the right amount of progress.
- Please ensure that you are monitoring what ICT your child is accessing during this lockdown. During the lockdown in the summer we know that there were occasions when pupils were accessing inappropriate sites and putting themselves at risk.
- Do try to keep the routines the same for children. We know that this supports all children in managing themselves, their feelings and their emotions.

Children in school.

We have registers of the children who should be in school. If your child is ill, please ensure that you contact the office so that we know they are unwell and record this. If your child is attending school then the curriculum and PE etc remains exactly the same and they will need the right clothes.

If your child has symptoms please ensure that you get a test for them and update us as soon as you get the results. If the results are positive we will identify who the close contacts of the child are and ask them to isolate for ten days. The ten days start from when they last had contact with the infected person. After ten days pupils can return to school and we will text parents to remind them.

Please ensure that we have your up-to-date contact details so that we are able to contact you quickly should we need to. This includes your email address. If we do not already have this, please contact Mr Gwalchmai in the school office.

Please, please remember that we understand the difficulties of home learning. If you are struggling with your child please email a member of staff in the team and they will get back to you, at the earliest opportunity.


Safeguarding.
