Personal, Social, Emotional Development

Children are learning to:

- Talk about different factors that support their health and wellbeing, such as toothbrushing, healthy eating and physical activity.
- Manage their own personal hygiene and needs
- Show resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge
- Build constructive and respectful relationships
- Express their feelings and consider the feelings of others.

Literacy

Children are learning to:

- Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words.
- Read digraphs and trigraphs
- Read some tricky words by sight
- Read simple phrases and sentences
- Spell words by identifying the sounds and then writing the sounds
- Write simple sentences with capital letters and full stops.

Some of the books we will read this term. are: Jungle mouth, town mouse and country mouse, the gingerbread man, Oliver's vegetables, Handa's surprise, Harry and the bucketful of dinosaurs and the Easter story.

Communication and Language

Children are learning to:

- Ask questions to find out more and to check they understand what has been said to them.
- Use new vocabulary
- Sing rhymes, poems and songs.
- Engage in non-fiction books.
- Retell stories with some exact words and repetition.
