

Dress up as a fairy tale character or a famous storyteller such as The Pied Piper, the Brothers' Grimm or Shakespeare!



Get children practising their speaking and listening through storytelling! Both tell children lots of stories in different ways, but also let children tell stories in lots of different ways. Think of it as practising reading aloud with expression – but adding as much fun into the day as possible!

## Whole School World Record Attempt

World's Longest Story Chain! We will be attempting to break the world record for the longest story chain in the world. Every child and adult in school will add a sentence to our story – possibly including some parents! Keep your eyes peeled for more information.

Suggested in class activities...

- Story Relay Get pupils to sit in a circle and tell a story one sentence at a time.
- **Story Dice** Create story dice with characters, settings, objects and actions on each side. Roll and tell stories.
- **Storytelling Stations** Have different stations for acting out a short scene/ drawing a character or setting/ making story sound effects/ writing the opening of a story.
- Fairy Tale Props Use props to re-tell fairy tales in dramatic fashion
- **Dark Storytelling** Turn out the lights, get under blankets and use torches to tell stories dramatically.
- Art Stories Create huge storyboards with paint or collage materials.
- Musical Storytelling Use instruments to tell stories with sound effects.
- Puppet Stories Make simple puppets and use to tell stories.
- Digital Storytelling Use an online tool like Storybird to create stories using media.
- AND read to your class and listen to them read as much as possible!
